5. Student Life at Sungshin

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| Health Insurance | Private Health Insurance (Mandatory) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As required by the Korean Ministry of Education, you are required to be covered by Korean private health insurance. For a one-time payment of around KRW 80,000, coverage is provided for six months (one semester). The purpose of this private insurance is to cover medical gaps that may arise from the time you enter the country until your National Health Insurance coverage begins, which can take several months. <u>The Certificate of Admission will be issued only after the payment has been confirmed.</u> Further details will be provided to students who have completed the application. |
| | National Health Insurance (Mandatory) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> National Health Insurance is mandated by the law. National Health Insurance is applied upon the issuance of the Residence Card. Details about registration and fees are TBA. Fees must be paid on a monthly basis.
