For comfortable stay in Korea during the study period, we recommend considering the cost for transportation, materials, and miscellaneous expenses etc.

6. Life at Duksung

DIA Ambassador (International Buddies)	<p>International students will be matched with DIA Ambassador members as a group. DIAA members will introduce you to campus life and help you adjust to the Korean culture and language. Most of all, they are friends with opened minds who are willing to learn your culture and share their experience with you. They will coordinate many activities throughout the semester that can enhance your stay in Korea.</p>
Student Organizations & Activities	<p>DWU has 34 registered student organizations and a variety of student clubs that cover a wide range of topics and interest areas, including but not limited to: academic, art, cultural, religious, social, and sports and leisure. Participating in student organizations will provide opportunities to connect with other students, develop social networks, explore arts and culture, and stay engaged in campus life.</p>
Global Lounge	<p>Global Lounge is a place where you can sit to talk with your friends, rest or chill. The lounge is equipped with tables and chairs and well as games and snacks for international students and friends. Official lounge hours are opened every week where games and activities are conducted for international students and Korean students to exchange and learn each other's culture. International students also can apply as lounge TAs to organize the Global Lounge.</p>
Health Care Service	<p>DWU clinic provides walk-in medical care to students, located in Student Union. Primary diagnosis of illness and basic drugs are given in free of charge.</p>



Intensive Korean Language Curriculum	International Students can learn Korean Language and culture in depth through the Intensive Korean Language Curriculum Provided by the Global Education institute. Language courses are divided into 6 different levels, and all students from who have no knowledge of Korean Language to those intending to pursuit to an advanced level are welcome to participate in the course. Each class will be consisted of less than 15 students. Exchange students are eligible to take this course at a 50% discount.
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7. Life in Korea

National Health Insurance Service	All international students who hold a D-2 student visa are subject to the mandatory subscription to the National Health Insurance Service. Upon immigration registration, students will be automatically subscribed to the insurance plan and must pay monthly insurance fees(around KRW 56,000 as of 2022). With National Health Insurance, hospital and pharmaceutical fees will be automatically deducted upon payments, and all health benefits will apply as same as Korean citizens.
Part-time Jobs	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Permission for part-time work for students International students need to get prior permission for part-time work. To obtain permission, you will need to submit the following forms and go through the necessary procedures. Once part-time work permission is authorized, undergraduate level students can work up to 20 hours per week. There is no cap on the working hours during weekends and vacations.2. Required documents<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Labor contract- Certificate of Part-Time Employment- Transcript of Certificate of attendance (Exempted if entered into the FIMS in advance)-Documents to prove Korean language ability
